Finished Quilt Size: 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ " or 91 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 91 $\frac{1}{2}$ " • Finished Block Size: 15"

For best results read all instructions before beginning. All seams are $\frac{1}{4}$ " – All strips are cut the width of the fabric, except as instructed otherwise – carefully trim all selvages.

Jinny's selection of fabrics in *Dumbarton Oaks*, features the perfect gradation of color with different color values from light to dark and furthermore achieving a subtle shading and adding more dimension in the overall quilt design.

Getting Started

The construction sequence for the two quilt sizes listed above will be exactly the same. The only difference are the measurements that are used to cut the strips in preparation for creating the borders and the number of pieces needed to create the correct number of blocks. As you work through the instructions, take care to select the measurements and cutting amounts that will result in the size quilt you desire. Yardage and cutting instructions for both colorways are the same. Diagrams are shown using colorway #1 and are not to scale. The measurements and cutting amounts given in each of the steps are for the 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square quilt. To make the 91 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square quilt follow the measurements and cutting amounts given in parenthesis (#).

1. Make templates for pieces A, B, and D from a see-through template material. **Make sure to add a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance around** all sides of each piece. Label each template and **mark the seam allowance on the template as well.**
2. Cut four - 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 92" (11 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 107") strips from the **length of fabric #4** for second border.
3. Cut 92" (107") from the length of the border fabric and set aside to create your borders in step 15.
4. For piece A, fussy cut each square on point by centering the template on one of the motifs in the large floral fabric making sure the flower is just inside the sewing line. Mark some portion of the design directly onto the
