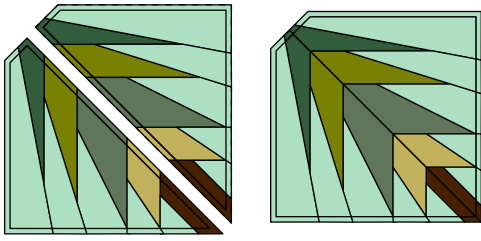
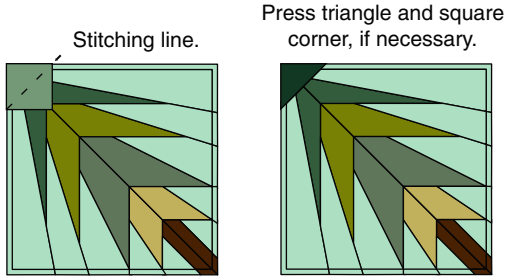


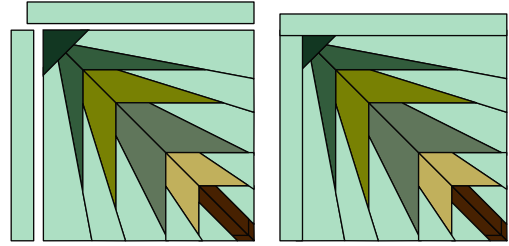
5. Once all fabrics are stitched to the paper block, piece the left sides and right sides of the trees together.



6. Stitch the 2" squares of Fabric 7 to the tops of the trees as shown.



7. Stitch the $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $9\frac{3}{4}$ " strips of Fabric 1 to the left side of the tree block. Then stitch the $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to top of the block. Square the block to $10\frac{1}{2}$ " before removing the paper.

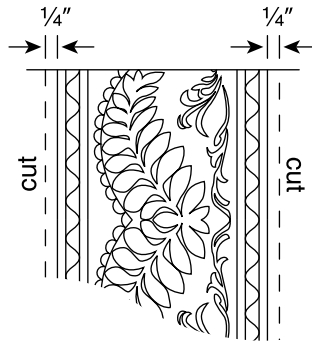


8. Complete 20 tree blocks.

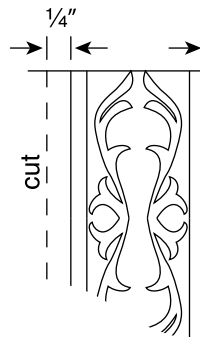
Cutting the Border Stripe

All strips are cut lengthwise from the fabric.

1. Cut the wide border stripe $4\frac{7}{8}$ " wide x the **length of the fabric**. The $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance beyond the outside of the stripe is included in the $4\frac{7}{8}$ " measurement. Cut 4 strips lengthwise.



2. The narrow border stripe is used in two areas of the quilt and is cut differently for each. For the inner border, cut the narrow stripe $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each edge of the gold stripe. Cut the strips 2" wide x the **length of fabric**. Cut 4 strips lengthwise.



3. Cut the narrow strips on the outside edge of the gold stripe to use around the alternate squares, sides and the border triangles. Cut 2 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x the **length of the fabric**, then cross-cut into 70 segments consisting of 5 scrolls each, with a mirror imaged motif in the center. The length of the strip of 5 scrolls is approximately $15\frac{1}{2}$ " long.
