







Geese in the Vineyard

Finished quilt size: 79³/₄" x 79³/₄"

All strips are to be cut crosswise on the grain of the fabric (width of the fabric) unless otherwise noted. Yardage is calculated for 42" wide fabric. Carefully trim off all selvages. **Please read the pattern carefully before you begin.**

Fabric Cutting Directions & Yardage Requirements

1		5103-3 Tan Paisley	Cut (3) 12 ¹ / ₂ " strips. From each strip, cut (3) 12 ¹ / ₂ " x 12 ¹ / ₂ " squares. Cut (2) 12 ⁷ / ₈ " strips. From each strip, cut (3) 12 ⁷ / ₈ " squares. Cut each square into two triangles by cutting from corner to corner once on the diagonal. Cut (1) 9 ³ / ₈ " strip. From this strip, cut (2) 9 ³ / ₈ " x 9 ³ / ₈ " squares. Cut each square into two triangles by cutting from corner to corner once on the diagonal. Cut (2) 3 ¹ / ₂ " strips. From each strip, cut (8) 3 ¹ / ₂ " x 3 ¹ / ₂ " squares.	2 ¹ / ₈ yds
2		5109-31 Cream Wood	Cut (26) 2" strips. From each strip, cut (20) 2" x 2" squares.	1 ⁵ / ₈ yds
3		5103-2 Dark Paisley	Cut (4) 6 ¹ / ₂ " strips. From each strip, cut (5) 6 ¹ / ₂ " x 6 ¹ / ₂ " squares.	7/8 yd
4		5106-21 Dark Green	Cut (8) 1 ¹ / ₂ " strips. Set aside for inner border. Cut (9) 2 ¹ / ₄ " strips. Set aside for binding.	1 yd
5		5100-2 Border Print	Fold the fabric to cut the border strips lengthwise. Cut four strips 5 ¹ / ₂ " x length of fabric, being careful to center the grape motifs in each strip.	2 ¹ / ₈ yds
6-9	Cream fat quarters		From each fabric, cut (3) 2" strips. Subcut each strip into (4) 2" x 3 ¹ / ₂ " rectangles. From each fabric, cut (2) 3 ⁷ / ₈ " strips. Subcut each strip into (4) 3 ⁷ / ₈ " x 3 ⁷ / ₈ " squares.	1/4 yd ea.
10-27	Colored fat quarters		From each fabric, cut (3) 2" strips. Subcut each strip into (4) 2" x 3 ¹ / ₂ " rectangles. From each fabric cut (1) 3 ⁷ / ₈ " strip. From each strip, cut (2) 3 ⁷ / ₈ " x 3 ⁷ / ₈ " squares.	1/4 yd ea.

To Make the Flying Geese Units:

Draw a diagonal line, from corner to corner, on the wrong side of the (512) 2" **Fabric 2** squares. Right sides together, layer a **Fabric 2** square with a 2" x 3¹/₂" **Fabric 6** rectangle and sew on the marked line. Trim the unit 1/4" inch from the seam line. Fold the resulting **Fabric 2** triangle up and press. Repeat this procedure for the other end of the rectangle. Repeat for the remaining 2" x 3¹/₂" rectangles from **Fabrics 6-27**. A total of 256 flying geese units are needed to make the quilt. Sew the individual flying geese units into strips of four. Refer to cover photo as a guide for fabric placement or place fabrics randomly.

To Make the Pieced Corner Squares:

Draw a diagonal line, from corner to corner, on the wrong side of the 3⁷/₈" squares cut from **Fabrics 6-9**. Right sides together, layer a marked square with any 3⁷/₈" square cut from **Fabrics 10-27**. Sew 1/4" on either side of the marked line. Cut apart on the drawn line and press the seams toward the darker fabric to make two pieced corner square units. Repeat the entire procedure 31 times to make a total of 64 pieced corner square units.

To Assemble the Pieced Blocks:

Refer to the quilt pictured on the cover for the correct placement of all units for the pieced blocks. Sew one flying geese strip unit to two opposite sides of a **Fabric 3** square, being careful to have the two strips of geese "flying" in opposite directions. Repeat 15 times for a total of 16 paisley square units. Sew one pieced corner square unit to each short end of a flying geese strip unit, being careful to place the lighter triangle next to the flying geese units. Repeat 31 times for a total of 32 units. Sew one of these units to each of the two remaining sides of a paisley square unit, being careful to have the two strips of "geese" pointing in opposite directions.

To Assemble the Quilt Top:

Using the quilt pictured on the cover as a guide, sew the 12¹/₂" **Fabric 1** squares, **Fabric 1** setting triangles, and pieced blocks into rows. The 12 larger **Fabric 1** triangles are used on the sides of the quilt, and the 4 smaller **Fabric 1** triangles are used for the corners. To complete the pieced portion of the quilt top, sew completed rows of blocks and setting triangles together.

To Make the Borders:

First make the corner square blocks. Draw a diagonal line, from corner to corner, on the wrong side of the (16) 3¹/₂" **Fabric 1** squares. Right sides together, layer a **Fabric 1** square with a 6¹/₂" **Fabric 3** square and sew on the marked line. Trim the unit 1/4" from the seam line. Fold the resulting **Fabric 1** triangle up and press. Repeat this procedure for the remaining three corners of the **Fabric 3** square. Repeat the entire procedure three more times for a total of four corner square blocks.

Trim the selvages from the (8) 1¹/₂" **Fabric 4** strips. Sew the strips together, end to end, to make one long 1¹/₂" strip. From this long strip, cut (4) 1¹/₂" x 68¹/₄" strips (If your measurements are different, cut to fit your quilt). Trim the four **Fabric 5** strips to 5¹/₂" x 68¹/₄" (If your measurements are different, cut to fit your quilt). Sew a **Fabric 4** strip to each **Fabric 5** strip to make four border units. Sew one border unit to the left side, and one to the right side of the quilt. Sew a corner square block to each end of the two remaining border units. Sew one of the resulting units to the top, and one to the bottom of the quilt.

Finishing:

Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Baste layers together. Quilt as desired. Bind the finished quilt using the 2¹/₄" **Fabric 4** strips.
