

(4) PLACEMATS (16" x 12")

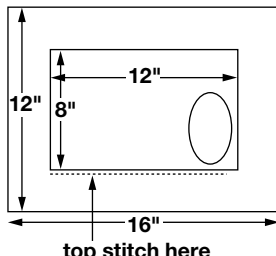

Materials needed

- 1 1/2 yards of insulated batting
- Rayon embroidery thread to match the pineapple and leaves
- 8" of fusible web with paper backing

Cut:

- 4 each 8 1/2" x 12 1/2" pieces from the woven print fabric (4823).
 - 4 each 12 1/2" x 16 1/2" pieces from the floral (4814) for back.
 - 8 each 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" pieces from the floral (4814).
 - 8 each 2 1/2" x 16 1/2" pieces from the floral (4814).
 - 4 each 12 1/2" x 16 1/2" pieces of insulated or light weight batting.
- Draw 4 pineapples and 4 leaves on the fusible web paper. Fuse pineapple to (4824) material and leaves to (4825-1 for Clr. 1 and 4822-21 for Clr. 2).



Pineapple Appliqué:

Mark four pineapple patterns and four leaf patterns on the paper side of the fusible web. Cut the leaf in one piece. Define the leaves with a satin stitch.

Place a piece of the fusible web on the small print fabric (4824). Cut on the lines for the four pineapples and on the green leaf (4825-1 for Clr. 1 and 4822-21 for Clr. 2) for the leaves.

Position the appliqué on the right-hand bottom of the woven (4823) print and press in place. The green leaves will be just under the pineapple on the top.

Place a piece of stabilizer on the back.

To define the pineapple, use the utility stitch with rayon thread and sew between the appliqué pieces in a grid pattern. Satin stitch around the outside of the pineapple.

Satin stitch the leaves with a matching thread, defining the leaves by sewing on the lines.

Sew the 8 1/2" stripes to the sides of the woven material and then the 16 1/2" sides to the top and bottom. Press well.

Lay the backing piece, finished front and the batting together. Pin in place. Sew around all sides and leave a small opening for turning. Turn and press well.

To define and hold the placemat together, stitch around the placemat on the floral print side with a utility stitch. Be sure to put embroidery thread in the bobbins as this will show on the backside. Stitch the opening closed. Enjoy!!!

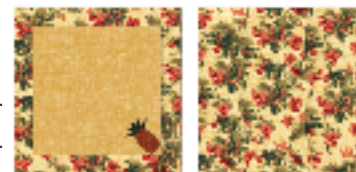

A utility stitch is a stitch, which is on most machines, that stitches over itself to give a more defined outline stitch. The utility stitch is marked directly on the machine.

(4) NAPKINS (18" x 18")

Instructions:

- Cut 4 each 18" squares from floral (4814).
- Cut 8 each 2 1/2" x 14 1/2" from floral (4814).
- Cut 8 each 2 1/2" x 18 1/2" from floral (4814).
- Cut 14 1/2" square from woven fabric (4823).

Lay a piece of paper backed fusible web on the back of the small print (4824) for pineapple, and leaf print for leaves (4825-1 for Clr. 1 and 4822-21 for Clr. 2). Draw the patterns on the paper and cut out along the lines.

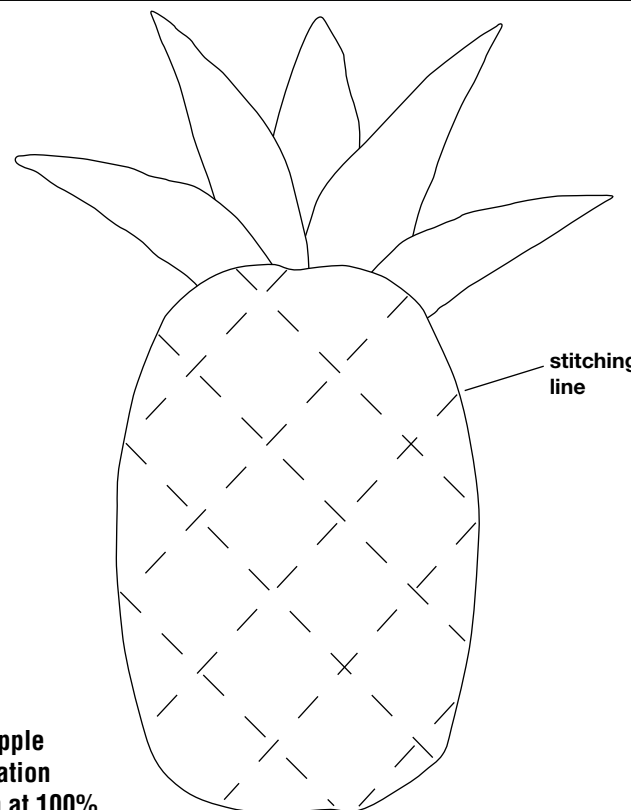
- Sew the 2 1/2" x 14 1/2" floral fabric (4814) to the sides of the woven fabric. Press seams to the outside.
- Sew the 2 1/2" x 18" of floral fabric (4814) to the other sides. Press to the outside.

Position the pineapple and leaves on the corner of the woven fabric. Place stabilizer behind, and outline the squares on the pineapple with the triple stitch, using thread the same shade as the pineapple. Outline the motif with the satin stitch. Outline the leaves with a green thread and satin stitch on the lines for definition;

Sew the back and front together and leave a couple of inches open to turn.

Turn and press well. Top stitch on the edge of the floral fabric to define and hold the two pieces together. Use the triple stitch in the same color as used for the pineapple motif. Enjoy!!
