Finished Quilt: 57" x 57"










All seams are 1/4"- All strips are cut the width of the fabric, except as instructed otherwise.

Skill Level: Intermediate - Advanced

An original design by Jinny Beyer, Mariposa features a gorgeous kaleidoscope design. Mariposa consist of eight pairs of mirror-imaged wedges. These sixteen wedges combine to form the inner star of the kaleidoscope design.

You may choose between following one of two variations of directions to make this quilt. The **fragmented design, "FD"** is recommended for the advanced quilter and the **striped design, "SD"** is recommended for the intermediate quilter. Please read the pattern **CAREFULLY** before you begin to make sure you are following the **FD** or **SD** instructions but **NOT** both.

<b>NOTE:</b> Follow the "FD" (fragmented design) or the "SD" (striped design) directions, depending on the quilt variation chosen.				
<b>Border Prints:</b>				
Border Print		6337-03	<b>Both FD &amp; SD:</b> From the wide stripe of the border print, cut 4 large borders lengthwise 51/4" by 68" long. From the narrow stripe of the border print, cut 4 small borders <b>lengthwise</b> 1" by 46" long from either the left or the right side of the stripe. Set aside the remaining border print for use in the quilt top.	4
Middle Border		6341-01	<b>Both FD &amp; SD:</b> Cut 4 strips 31/2" wide the <b>length</b> of the fabric (approximately 63" long).	7/8
<b>NOTE:</b> Cut lengthwise. (13/4" split <b>lengthwise</b> down the middle of the fabric.)				
<b>Wedge Fabrics:</b> These fabrics are used in the fragmented or striped section of the wedge and the themed fabrics as well. Directions for cutting the narrow border stripes are provided later in the pattern. Use only the cutting directions for the quilt design being made, either <b>FD</b> or <b>SD- BUT not both.</b>				
Fabric #1		6341-03	<b>FD: Cut 10 strips - 11/8" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).</b> SD: Cut 8 strips – 11/4" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).	3/8
Fabric #2		6341-01	<b>FD: Cut 10 strips - 11/8" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).</b> SD: Cut 8 strips – 11/4" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).	3/8
Fabric #3		6340-04	<b>FD: Cut 10 strips - 11/8" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).</b> SD: Cut 8 strips – 11/4" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).	3/8
Fabric #4		6343-03	<b>FD: Cut 10 strips - 11/8" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide). Using Template L cut 8 pieces from the strips and also 8 pieces using Template L(r).</b> SD: Cut 8 strips – 11/4" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).	1/2
Fabric #5		6340-03	<b>FD: Cut 10 strips - 11/8" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).</b> SD: Cut 8 strips – 11/4" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).	3/8
Fabric #6		6342-04	<b>FD: Cut 8 strips - 11/8" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).</b> SD: Cut 4 strips – 11/4" the width of the fabric (approximately 42" wide).	1/4
