

Migration Quilt

Sewing instructions:

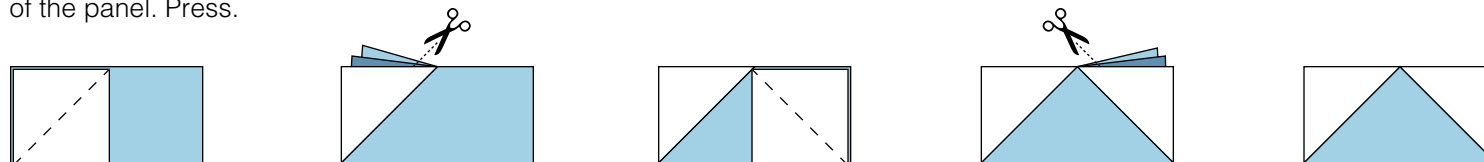
1. Starting with 8 of the 2¹/₂" (G) squares of *Light Pine Cone Silhouette* and 4 – 2¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" (H) *Red Bark* rectangles, make four flying geese units: Place right sides together and sew the square (G) onto the rectangle unit (H) diagonally, along the center of the square. You can mark this with a pencil line or press the square in half diagonally, and sew on the pressed line. Refer to the illustration. Press. Trim 1/4" away from the stitching line. Sew the second square (G) onto the other side of the geese unit. Follow the same steps as described above for pressing and trimming. Repeat the same technique using 1 - 2¹/₂" x 4¹/₂" rectangle (I) cut from the *Pine Cone Silhouette* and 2 - 2¹/₂" squares (F).

Repeat for the *Blue Tracks* sewing 6 – GH flying geese units and 1 – IF flying geese unit.

Repeat for the *Packed Cones* sewing 7 – GH flying geese units and 1 – IF flying geese unit.

2. Referring the illustration, sew the small *Red Bark* arrow together using 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Sew the small *Blue Tracks* arrow together. Press. Join together in a row, adding the A, B, and C *Pine Cone Silhouette* rectangles. Sew the small *Packed Cones* arrow together. Join in a row with the D and E *Pine Cone Silhouette* rectangles. Sew this row to the top of the panel. Press.

Sew the *Red Bark/Blue Tracks* arrow row to the left-hand side of the panel. Press.



3. Make 5 flying geese units using the 4¹/₂"x 8¹/₂" *Packed Cones* rectangles (L). Repeat sewing the flying geese as in **Step 1**, using the 4¹/₂" *Pine Cone Silhouette* squares (M). Make 5 of these LM units. Also make one NS unit.

Repeat for the *Blue Tracks* L rectangles sewing 3 – LM flying geese units and 1 – NS flying geese unit. Repeat for the *Red Bark* rectangles.

4. Sew the large *Packed Cones* arrow together. Press. Join in a row with the R *Pine Cone Silhouette* rectangle. Press. Sew this row to the bottom of the panel.

Sew the large *Blue Tracks* arrow together, then the large *Red Bark* arrow. Press. Join in a row with P and Q rectangles. Press. Sew this row to the right side of the quilt.

5. To make the checkerboard border, sew a 2¹/₂" strip of the *Tossed Trees* to a 2¹/₂" strip of the *Black Bark*, right sides together, using 1/4" seam allowance. Press toward the dark. Repeat for all the strips. Cut apart every 2¹/₂". You need 96 units. Sew together into four long strips using 24 of the units. Referring to the illustration, sew these to the sides of the quilt. Press. Sew the other two strips to the top and bottom of the quilt, matching the checkerboard pattern.

6. Layer and quilt as desired. We suggest using outline quilting and in-the-ditch quilting around the flying geese units.

Finish the quilt with binding.

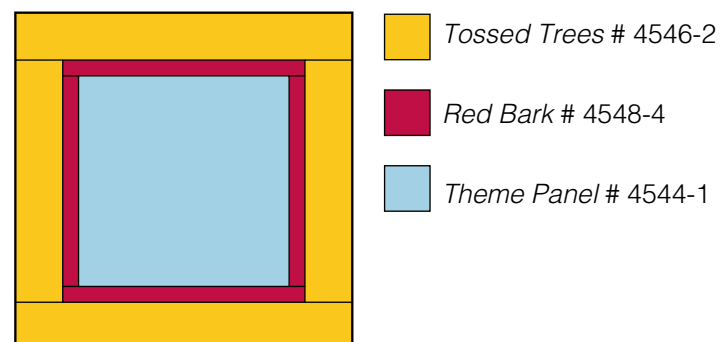
Migration Pillows (2)

These cute and easy pillows also feature the panel print from the Seasons in the Pines flannel line. We have framed the panel for added size and visual impact.

Materials Needed for Two Pillows:

- 1/2 yard *Four Seasons in the Pines* panel (# 4544-1)
- 1/4 yard *Red Bark* (# 4548-4)
- 1/2 yard *Gold Tossed Trees* (# 4546-2)
- 5/8 yard *Packed Cones* (# 4552-3)
- Stuffing



Cutting Instructions:

- Cut 2 – 12¹/₂" squares from the *Four Seasons in the Pines* panel.
- Cut 4 – 1¹/₄" x 42" strips from the *Red Bark*. From these strips cut 4 – 1¹/₄" x 12¹/₂" strips for the sides of the panel. Also cut 4 – 1¹/₄" x 14" strips for the top and the bottom of the panel.
- Cut 4 – 2³/₄" x 42" strips from the *Gold Tossed Trees*. From these strips cut 4 – 2³/₄" x 14" strips for the sides of the panel. Cut 4 – 2³/₄" x 18¹/₂" strips for the top and the bottom of the panel.
- Cut 2 – 18¹/₂" squares from the *Packed Cones*.

Sewing Instructions:

- Sew the two 1¹/₄" x 12¹/₂" strips to the sides of the panel. Press. Sew the two 1¹/₄" x 14" strips to the top and bottom of the pillow. Press.
- Sew the two 2³/₄" x 14" strips to the sides of the panel. Press. Sew the two 2³/₄" x 18¹/₂" strips to the top and bottom of the pillow. Press.
- Sew the pillow top to the back, right sides together, leaving a 6" opening along the bottom for turning and stuffing. Turn the pillow. Stuff. Hand-stitch the opening closed.
